As a result of the inter-town games concluded on Saturday between the North Battleford and the Battleford Curling clubs, the northern town once again retains possession of the Brown Cup; Battleford having been defeated by only a small margin. The Brown Cup was donated in 1912 by Dr. J. Brown, a one time resident of Battleford. Six games at home, and six games abroad feature play for this trophy. North Battleford curlers have been successful in capturing the cup for the last five years in succession.
